School Site Presentations

The Single Plan for Student Achievement (SPSA) is a document that represents a school's cycle of continuous improvement of student achievement. The annual process of developing, reviewing, and updating the SPSA includes a comprehensive review of data and the development of actions necessary to achieve school goals. The plan also addresses funding and proposed expenditures related to state and federal categorical programs. The SPSA is specifically designed to align with the state's eight priorities of the LCAP and LJSD's Strategic Goals. Each year, the School Site Council and the local governing board approve the SPSA.



Collaborating on the 2017-18 SPSA, El Portal took the following steps:

- Parents and staff reviewed and discussed actions and **progress on the 2016-17 goals** at School Site Council (SSC) meetings with feedback from the English Language Advisory Committee (ELAC) representative, PTA meetings, and staff meetings.
- We **reviewed information on the California Dashboard** to see which areas are in need of improvement.
- We discussed and reviewed the **input from the Parent Survey**.
- With the help of the **El Portal stakeholders**, the 2017-18 SPSA goals and actions steps were created.

School Goal: Seventy-five percent of our students will increase their lexile level by 25 points per trimester as measured by the Scholastic Reading Inventory Growth Report.

Strengths

- 6th grade cohort of students in grades improved in both ELA and mathematics.
- The chronic absentee rate improved at Jordan to exceed district average.

Areas for Continuous Improvement

- Over a third of students in grades 3-6 did not meet proficiency in ELA
- Half of of students in grades 3-6 did not meet proficiency in mathematics
- An achievement gap exists between our Socio-Economically
 Disadvantaged (SED) sub-group and the non- SED group
- An achievement gap continues to exist between our English Language Learner subgroup and our non-English Language Learners.



School Goal: By August of 2018 grade level cohorts in grades 4th, 5th, and 6th will increase the percentage of students scoring "Standards Exceeded/Met" in ELA by 3%. 4th grade will increase from 51% to 54%, 5th grade will increase from 53% to 56%, and 6th grade will increase from 58% to 61%.

Using a team approach, Macy collaboratively reviews the District Goals, the LCAP Goals, and school site data. Based on findings, the team drafts School Goals based on identified areas of need that align and support District and LCAP Goals.

This year, the Macy SPSA highlights three 'ongoing' goals from last year, which are:

- 1. Decreasing the rate of Chronic Absenteeism
- 2. Increase percentage of Met Achievement Standards with Macy's 5th grade class.
- 3. Increase percentage of Met Achievement Standards with Macy's 6th grade class.

The Leadership Team and I have further identified two new 'new' goals for the year, which are:

- 5. By May 2018, school wide behavioral referrals will be decreased by 5%, from 177 to 168, as measured by data results from Aeries.
- 6. By May 2018, school wide suspensions will be decreased by 50%, from 32 to 16, as measured by data results from Aeries.

School goals will be reviewed by the Macy School Site Council in November. Clear timelines and strategies have been set for addressing the goals as listed in the Macy SPSA.

Rancho-Starbuck's Single Plan for Student Achievement goals were a collaborative process. The following steps outline the collaboration by our team.

- Rancho-Starbuck's Interdisciplinary Leadership team reviewed CAASPP data and 2016-2017 goals.
- Content area departments analyzed data including benchmark scores and state test scores.
- Each department created SMART goals to create an action plan and a process to monitor progress.
- Single Plan goals were presented to and reviewed by our School Site Council.
- Each content area considered action steps to support overall school department goals.
- The entire staff collaborated on possible actions steps to increase achievement and provide a clear focus for the 2017-2018 school year.
- Each department presented their goals and action steps to the staff.
