The past three weeks have certainly been challenging for our entire Lowell Family and we cannot thank everyone enough for their patience, grace, mercy, and care. Keep breathing and know that we really will get through these challenges and storms. It is definitely "all-hands on deck" right now and thank God, the storm has already started to calm down. Lowell Joint will continue to weather the storms because are feet are on solid rock. The State, CDPH and CAL/OSHA continue to update

and change their orders every 2-4 days and indeed the past few days have certainly been that: The latest State, CPHD and CAL/OSHA order links are: (<u>California Department of Public Health Education Health Order</u>) (<u>CDPH Order</u>).

Some key updates and related information:

- We want to clarify one of the latest changes, which was just last Friday night. LA and Orange County Public Health adjusted that we are to do a form of contact tracing called group tracing where we are to notify "groups" of exposed students such as classmates, teammates, or cohorts. The detailed OC Health Care Agency <u>issued an updated health order</u> and a similar order came out from LA-CDPH.
- Another question was asked, "why are we not considering closing school". The short answer is that there isn't a Governor Executive Order authorizing school closures other than a "Form J-13A request for a COVID-19 related closure due to LEA staffing shortages" (New: January 7, 2022). LJSD has been so blessed with an incredible staff who are doing everything they can to serve, cover open spots, and do whatever we need to do to support our students. - Free COVID-19 Testing Resources:
 - You may not have heard that the Federal Government has stated that they will provide all residential households in the U.S. the opportunity to order one set of four free at-home tests from USPS.com. Order here: <u>https://special.usps.com/testkits</u>
 - You already know that the State has provided a one-time limited number of free at-home rapid antigen test kits for students. In order to help them last longer, we have been very careful to provide these to all students who: a) show symptoms, b) been sent home ill, or c) were a close contact. Again, our goal is to help make these free resources last as long as possible.
 - The State did not provide any free take-home test for staff; therefore, we purchased a free test kit for every staff member and they have been available through your front school office.
 - <u>We continued partnership with the City of La Habra:</u> This free PCR test resource began beginning last August and remains available for students and staff. However, due to high demand for testing the wait time has increased. The good news is that this rush has slowed down, which makes the wait time much shorter. If you have a chance, please thank the City of La Habra for our continued partnership.
- Up-to-Date Vaccine Status:

Please note that the OCHCA considers individuals to be "up-to-date" with their vaccination status if they have completed a primary series of COVID-19 vaccine and have either received a booster shot or are not yet recommended to receive a booster dose according to current guidance.

- Keep students home, if they are suspected or confirmed to have COVID-19.
