This is beyond frustrating and means that schools in Los Angeles County are not allowed to open yet. The reality is that there are not enough weeks between now and Christmas Break to meet the criteria to reopen; therefore, based on anticipated lack of improvement over the next 5-6 weeks, we will anticipate reopening on Monday, January 4, 2021.
